## Reflection for Nostalgia Poem...

I chose to focus my nostalgia poem on my family's annual summer trips to Montauk. This was my absolute favorite place to vacation with and spend time with my family. I can clearly remember so many specific details of the times we spent there, both large and small, from the ice cream shop we would visit each night, to the sound our car made as it pulled into the pebbled parking lot of the condo. I took a trip out to Montauk a few years back, and so much had changed. Familiar shops had changed names or closed, crowds had swelled. It just didn't feel the same, and I longed for the opportunity to go back to the way it was, to bring back the magical quality I felt as a child.

While revising my poem, I made a few decisions to make it more precise. I also decided to isolate the "windmill / standing like a gallant knight" to its own line.
